State Pediatric Legislative Advocacy Highlights:

Representing the Oregon Pediatric Society and the Oregon Medical Association I along with other physicians have worked on the passage of bills that require Vitamin K administration for newborns; the use of car seats, booster seats and seat belts for children; prohibit corporal punishment in public schools; the use of approved helmet use for children <16 years of age while riding bikes, skateboards, inline skates and scooters; repealed the defense of using spiritual treatment in child abuse and neglect; require newborn hearing screening; expansion of newborn metabolic screening; insurance coverage for children with inborn errors of metabolism; allow the use of glucagon and epinephrine for students in schools; establish the guidelines for the best interests of the child when determining the parental rights or termination; the removal of HIV screening opt in requirements for pregnant women; mandating employers to provide safe and sanitary areas for mothers to express breast milk while at work; EMS-C support; prohibiting children from riding in the back of pickups; modifying the Oregon Health Plan to improve access for children; neonate abandonment process; mandated PE in public schools; limited junk food in schools. We were able to get administrative rules process change to mandate the 4-sided enclosure of swimming pools and spas; to mandate the use of personal flotation devices for children <14 years of age on public waterways. We have instituted a preventive program to prevent Shaken Baby Syndrome in our hospitals for parents of newborns.

At present I am working on helping to implement the Healthy Kids program to ensure universal healthcare coverage for all children in Oregon. I am also on a work group to implement the Federal ACA program in Oregon which is called Coordinated Care Organization.
